

Eternal Light Columbarium

A four-sided glass-front columbarium standing indoors at Washington Memorial Park: what a niche there is, what it costs, and how few are left.

Eternal Light is a freestanding four-sided glass columbarium, indoors, in a lit corridor of the Eternal Light Mausoleum attached to the Chapel of Memories. Every niche is closed with glass, so the urn and what you place beside it stay visible, and every one carries 2 rights of interment — the larger units included.



The Eternal Light Columbarium stands free in the corridor, so you can walk right around it.

It is the most varied of our glass-front locations. The niches are not a uniform grid: they run from single small openings up to tall units two rows high, and the prices run accordingly.

THE FOUR FACES

Four Faces, Clear Corners

Two broad elevations, two ends, and no niche wrapping a corner



A broad face, straight on. The empty niches are the ones still for sale.

The columbarium has four faces: two broad elevations (south, and the front, which faces north) and two narrower ends (east, at the front door, and west). The corners are solid, so no niche is visible from two sides at once; a niche belongs to

exactly one face.

THE FOUR FACES

FACE	NICHES	WHAT IT IS
South	31	A broad elevation, and the largest face.
Front (north)	30	The other broad elevation.
West	12	A narrow end.
East (front door)	12	The narrow end nearest the entrance.

A niche here is closed with glass and lit, so the urn and a photograph or keepsake beside it are part of the memorial. Size and height set the price.

GLASS FRONT • TWO RIGHTS • MORE ROOM TO ARRANGE

The tall two-row openings give a family a display rather than a shelf. They still carry two rights of interment, like every other niche here.

What It Costs

The niche, the charges alongside it, and two optional bronzes

ADDITIONAL CHARGES

Opening and closing, recording, endowment care and any inscription are charged in addition to the price of the space. They are straightforward, and they differ by location and by what you choose. Call or email me and I will put the exact figures in writing for you, with no obligation.

WHERE THE TAX APPLIES

The niche itself is not taxed, and neither are the Endowment Care Fund contribution, the opening and closing or the recording fee. The bronze scroll and the vase are merchandise, and those two are taxed at 10.4%. Both are optional.

WHAT IS OPEN TODAY

What Is Available Now

A small, genuinely limited number

21 of the 85 niches at Eternal Light are for sale today. This is a finished columbarium in an established building rather than a brand-new one, so what is left is what is left. The sizes and heights still on offer are not evenly spread across the four faces. If a particular face or height matters to you, it is worth asking early.

BEFORE YOU COME OUT

Decide whether the urn should be visible. Everything else about a glass front follows from that one answer. **Choose the urn with the niche, not after it** — behind glass the urn is the thing people see. Decide whether you want either of the two optional bronzes, the scroll or the vase with ring. And ask early: there are **21** niches left here, and a particular face or height may not stay available.

Ranges here are computed from the price and availability data behind our live niche maps, so they describe what is offered for sale today and move as spaces sell. I confirm the exact niche, its price and today's availability before anything is signed.

Ask before a face closes

Eternal Light is indoors and takes a few minutes to walk right around. Tell me the face and the height you have in mind and I will tell you what is open on it today, what it costs, and put it in writing with no obligation.

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
