

Mountain View New Glass-Front Niches

The new glass-front island inside the Mountain View Columbarium: what it is, what it costs, and why every opening on it is still open.

A glass-front niche is closed with glass instead of stone, so the urn and whatever you place beside it stay visible. This island is brand new: a freestanding case in the middle of the columbarium room, glazed on all four sides and lit from within, and nothing on it has been sold. Openings carry 2–4 rights of interment.

The openings are not all one size. They run from a single-urn niche on the top and bottom courses up to large multi-urn family units in the middle of the long walls, and the price follows the size and the height.

THE ROOM

The Room It Stands In

Indoors, carpeted, and warm



The columbarium room. The island stands in the centre; the older glass-front walls line the sides.

The Mountain View Columbarium is an eight-sided room with a stained-glass clerestory and a chandelier, carpeted, heated and dry. Families visit in any weather and stay as long as they like; it is the part of the park that feels least like being

outdoors and most like being somewhere indoors that was built for this.

FOUR FACES

Four Walls, Nine Sizes

Two long faces, two ends, and a family unit in the middle of each long face



An end wall. The courses are 10½ inches high at the bottom and 12½ at the top.



A long face. The wider openings across the middle are the family units.

The two long faces carry **48** and **51** openings and the two ends **23** each. They come in **9** distinct sizes, from a single-urn niche up to the two-course family units in the middle of each long face.

GLASS FRONT · THE URN STAYS VISIBLE

The standard opening on the island. Height and width both vary, and so does the price, with the courses near eye level costing more than the top and bottom ones.

MOST NICHES HERE

\$8,000–\$16,000

Full range \$7,000–\$48,000

GLASS FRONT · FOUR RIGHTS OF INTERMENT

The largest openings span two courses in the middle of a long face, and there are 4 of them on the island. They hold four, which makes them a place for a whole family rather than a couple.

FAMILY UNITS

\$42,000–\$48,000

Across the island the openings carry 2–4 rights of interment, depending on the size of the opening. Full range across every opening on the island: \$7,000–\$48,000.

What It Costs

The niche, and the charges alongside it

ADDITIONAL CHARGES

Opening and closing, recording, endowment care and any inscription are charged in addition to the price of the space. They are straightforward, and they differ by location and by what you choose. Call or email me and I will put the exact figures in writing for you, with no obligation.

TWO THINGS WORTH KNOWING

There is no inscription charge on a glass-front niche. The name is carried on the glass rather than cut into stone, and there is no separate engraving line to pay for.

A glass-front niche here is not taxed. The niche, the Endowment Care Fund contribution, the opening and closing and the recording fee carry no sales tax.

BEFORE YOU COME OUT

Settle one question first: should the urn be visible? That is what separates a glass front from a granite one, and everything else follows it. **Then choose the urn early** — behind glass the urn is part of the memorial rather than something hidden inside it, and the size of the opening decides what fits. Last, decide how many people the niche is for: a standard opening, or one of the family units.

Ranges here are computed from the price and availability data behind our live niche maps, so they describe what is offered for sale today and move as spaces sell. I confirm the exact opening, its price and today's availability before anything is signed.

Come and see it lit

The island photographs poorly and looks like a different thing in the room. It is indoors and takes ten minutes to walk. I will tell you what any opening in front of you costs and put it in writing, with no obligation attached.

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
