

Terrace Garden Memorial Path

The newest cremation property at Washington Memorial Park: a granite niche bank, nine individual memorials along a planted path, and nothing on it sold yet.

Two things, one garden

A paved terrace runs between the mausoleum wings, and there are two quite different things for sale on it. A freestanding black granite niche bank of **40** niches stands across the far end, priced by row. Along the walk stand **9** individual memorials, each holding cremated remains in its own right. All of it is new; nothing here has been sold.



The Memorial Path, looking down the terrace. The small granite posts either side of the walk are individual memorials.

A bluestone and river-rock circle sits at the centre of the terrace, with planted beds either side of the walk and the niche bank across the far end.

THE NICHE BANK

The Niche Bank

Forty granite-front niches, eight across and five rows high



The fronts are blank and polished. Names are engraved into the granite itself.

GRANITE FRONT · TWO RIGHTS OF INTERMENT

The bank is eight niches across and five rows high, and it is priced by row: the middle row is the highest and the top and bottom rows the lowest. Niches are addressed TGN-C-4 and so on.

BY ROW

\$12,000–\$16,000

Every niche in the bank carries 2 rights of interment, so a couple is one contract.

ALONG THE PATH

Along the Path

Nine individual memorials, from a single post to a companion columbarium



Cremation posts

GRANITE POST · ONE OR TWO RIGHTS

The smallest memorials on the path, set into the bark beds either side of the walk. Single posts hold one; a double post holds two, and some carry a carved rose, daffodils or birds.

POSTS

\$8,000–\$16,000



Benches, columbarium and birdbath

GRANITE · TWO TO FOUR RIGHTS

The larger pieces: two pedestal benches, a companion columbarium with an alcove, and a birdbath on a pedestal. Each holds cremated remains inside it.

LARGER MEMORIALS

\$24,000–\$52,000

The 9 memorials along the path carry 1–4 rights of interment, depending on the piece, and run \$8,000–\$52,000 across the whole set. Ask us for the item-by-item list if you want to compare them side by side.

What It Costs

ADDITIONAL CHARGES

Opening and closing, recording, endowment care and any inscription are charged in addition to the price of the space. They are straightforward, and they differ by location and by what you choose. Call or email me and I will put the exact figures in writing for you, with no obligation.

About these charges. The same ones apply across the whole path, bank and individual memorials alike. They follow the **Mountain View Columbarium, June 2026** schedule, confirmed 2026-07-29; no fees appear on it this location's own sheet, which prints a price and a rights count and nothing else.

WHAT YOU WILL ACTUALLY SEE

What You Will See Today

The garden as built, not as drawn

The beds are dark bark mulch. The marketing artwork for the Terrace Garden draws them as bright green turf; the built garden has bark around the posts, which is what every photograph in this guide shows and what you will find when you walk it. We would rather you saw it here than were surprised by it there.

The pool is gone — an earlier plan showed a reflection pool and the path replaced it entirely. **And the planting is young.** The beds and the planters are still filling in; the stone, the posts and the niche bank are finished and in place.

BEFORE YOU COME OUT

Decide between the niche bank and an individual memorial along the path. They are very different things: one is a place in a wall, the other a piece of granite that is yours alone. If it is the bank, the row is what sets the price. If it is the path, decide how many rights you need — the pieces run from one to four. Then walk it. It is a small garden and ten minutes in it answers most of the questions.

Ranges here are computed from the price and availability data behind our live niche maps, so they describe what is offered for sale today and move as spaces sell. I confirm the exact placement, its price and today's availability before anything is signed.

The Terrace Garden is small and everything on it is still open, so this is the one place here where you can genuinely pick. Tell me which piece and I will confirm the price and the rights count in writing, with no obligation attached.

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
